

How to Seek Labor's Endorsement

Municipal Candidates

The Greater Boston Labor Council endorses candidates that share our values and will work toward passing and upholding pro-union and progressive policies in their elected positions.

Candidates seeking municipal office in any of the GBLC's cities and towns are eligible to request the labor council's endorsement. *Please note: The Boston Mayor's race has a separate endorsement timeline.*

Here's how to get started requesting labor's endorsement in your 2021 Municipal political race:

1. **Email us to request endorsement.**
2. Fill out and return a **GBLC Candidate Questionnaire** online by June 1, 2021.
3. Complete a **Candidate Interview with the GBLC Political Committee** (held virtually during pandemic). Interviews will be held in late June or early July and you will be contacted with your assigned time.
4. **Attend a GBLC C.O.P.E (Committee on Political Education) meeting.** Successful candidates will receive 2/3 approval by the Committee and then receive a 2/3 ratification vote at the Delegates' meeting that follows. Both meetings occur on July 20, 2021.
